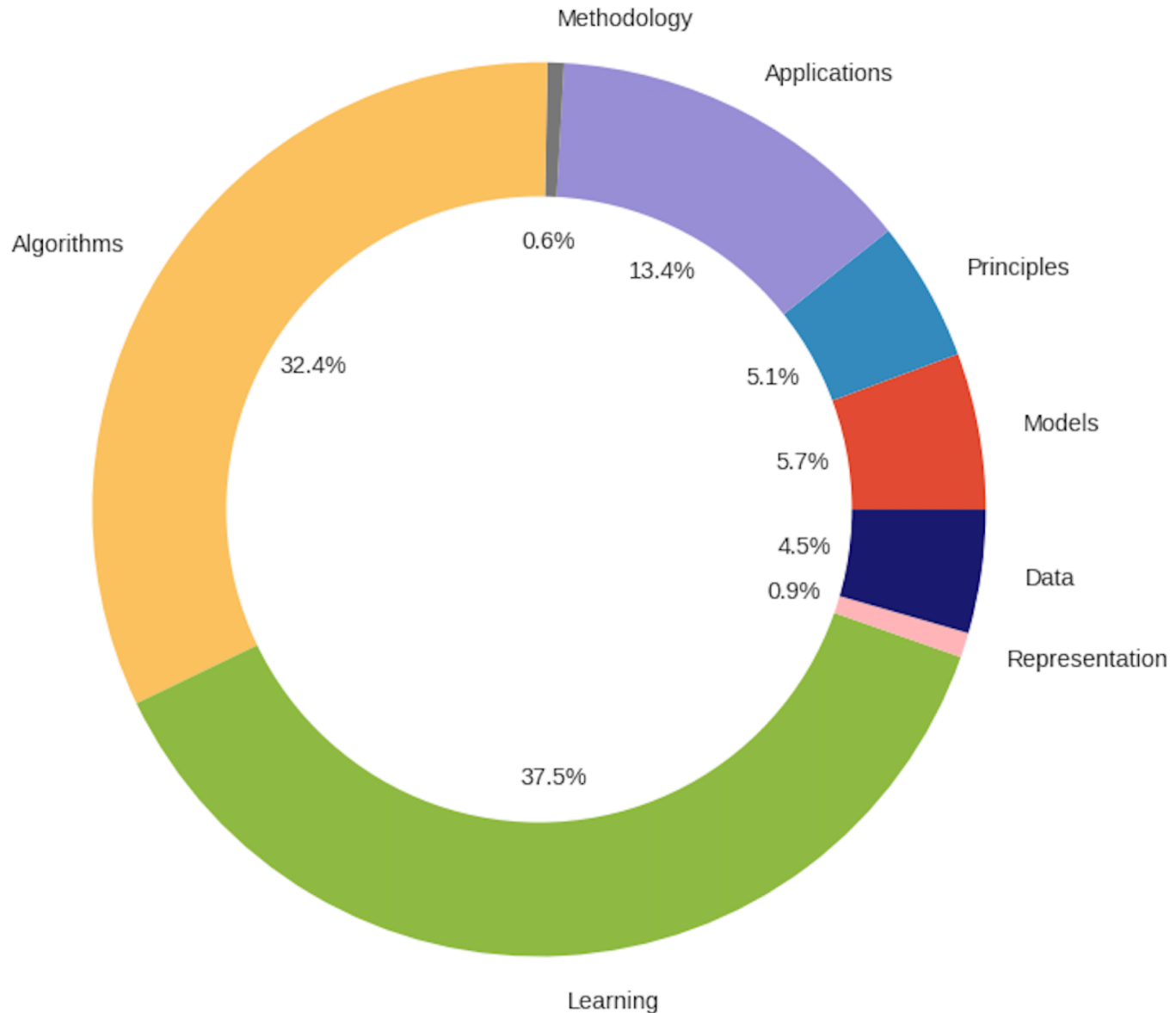
Review process

 - 285 PC members (~35 helpers)

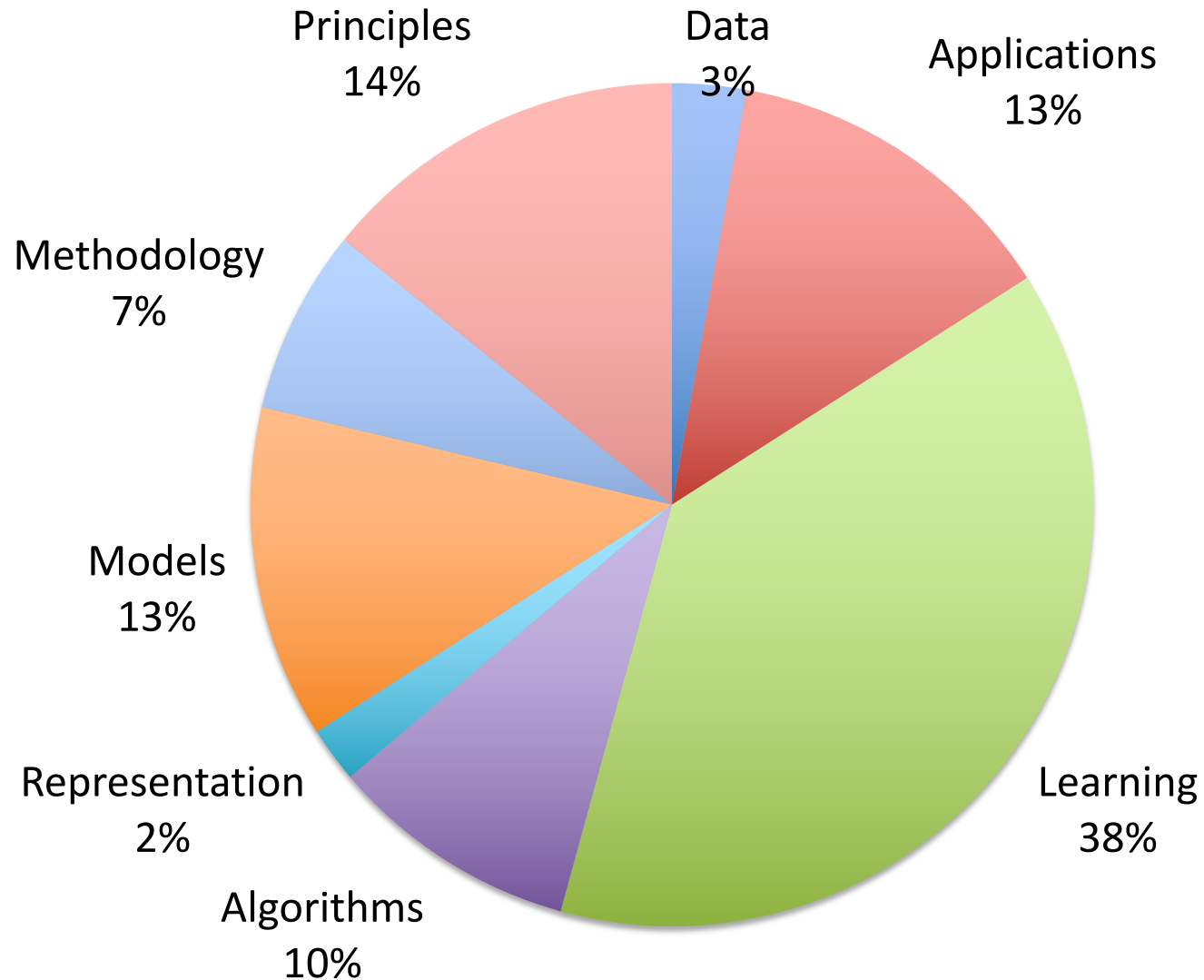

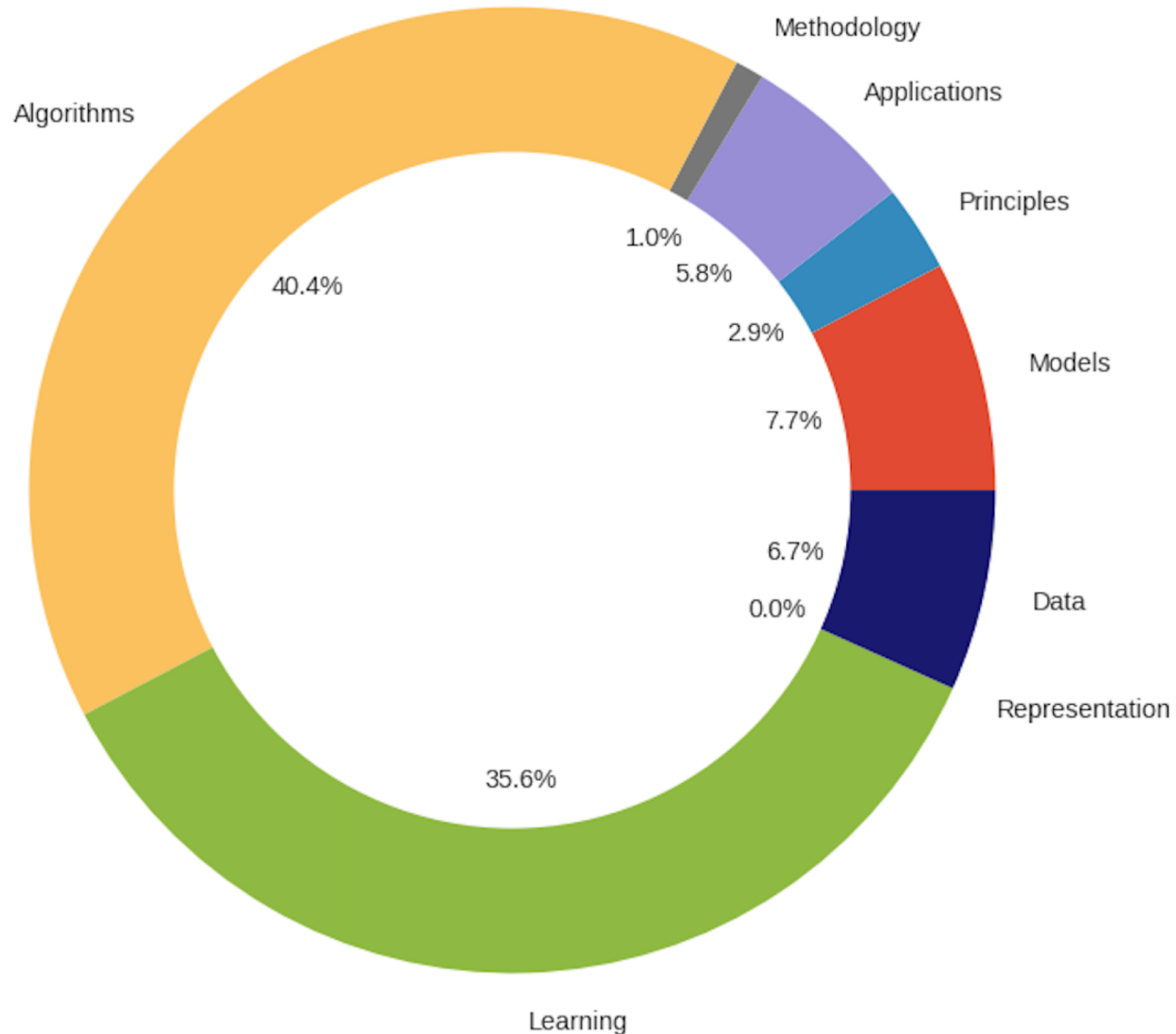
Submissions By Primary Subject Area



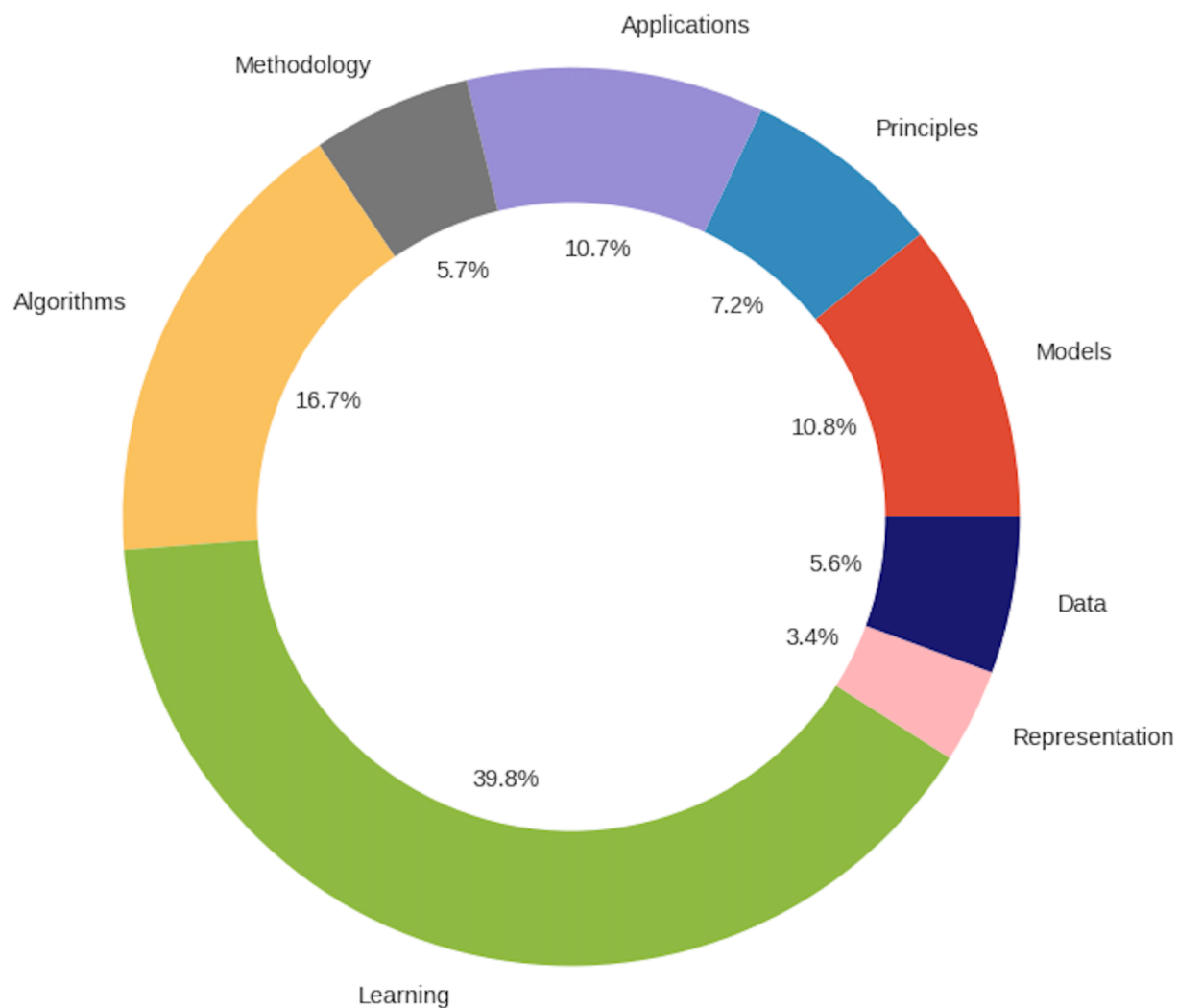

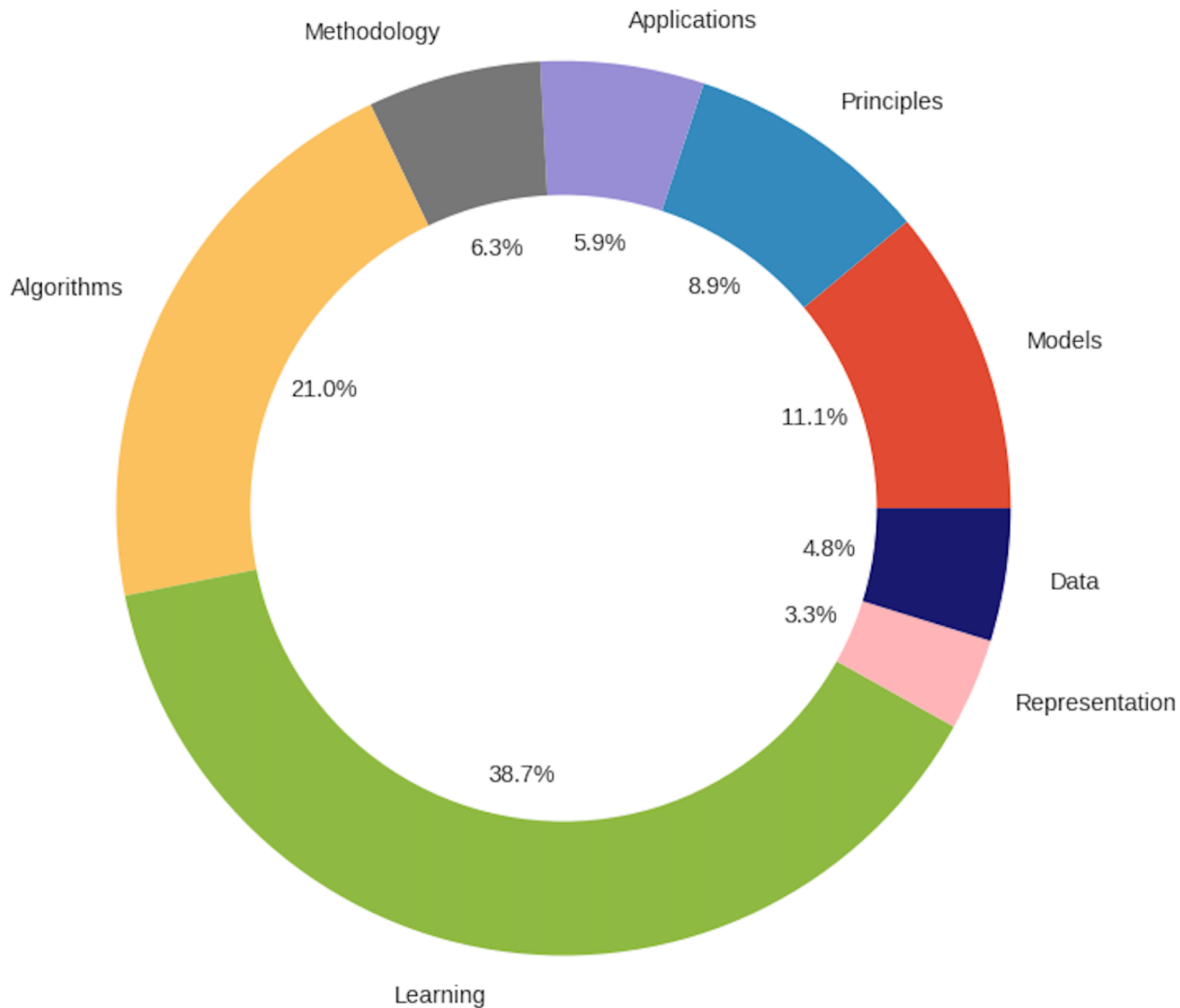
Accepted Papers By Primary Subject Area



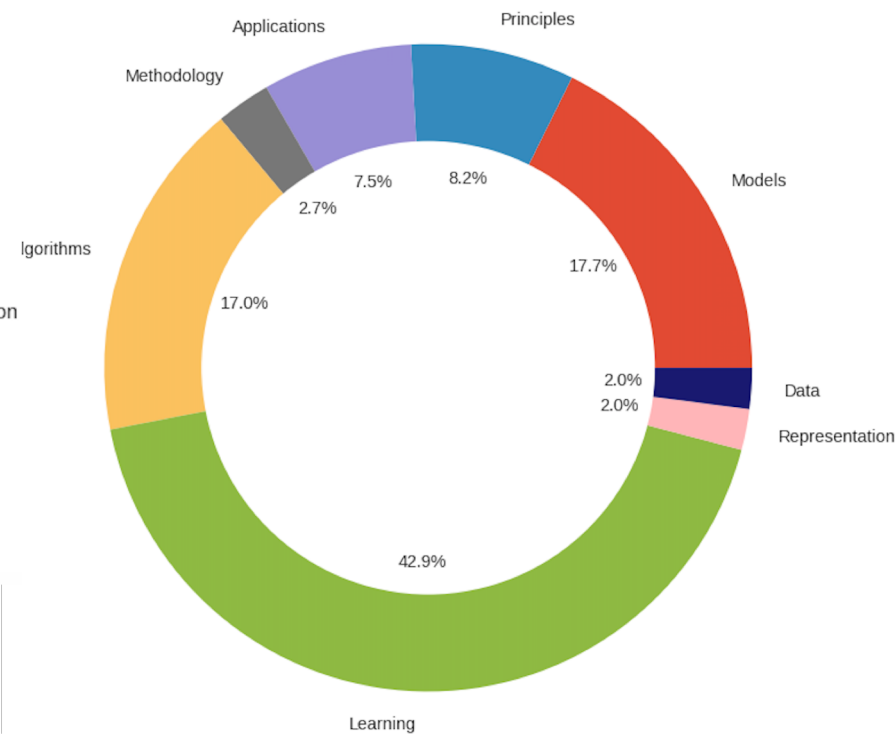
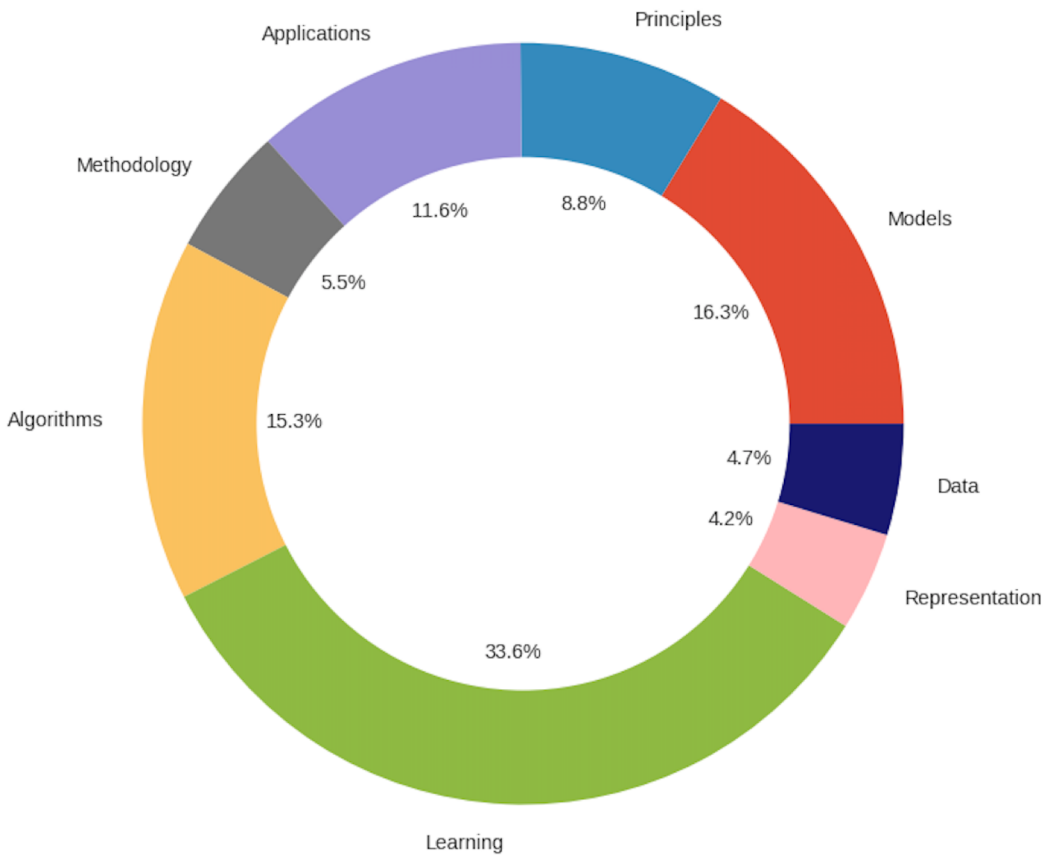
Submissions By All Subject Areas



Accepted Papers (All Areas)

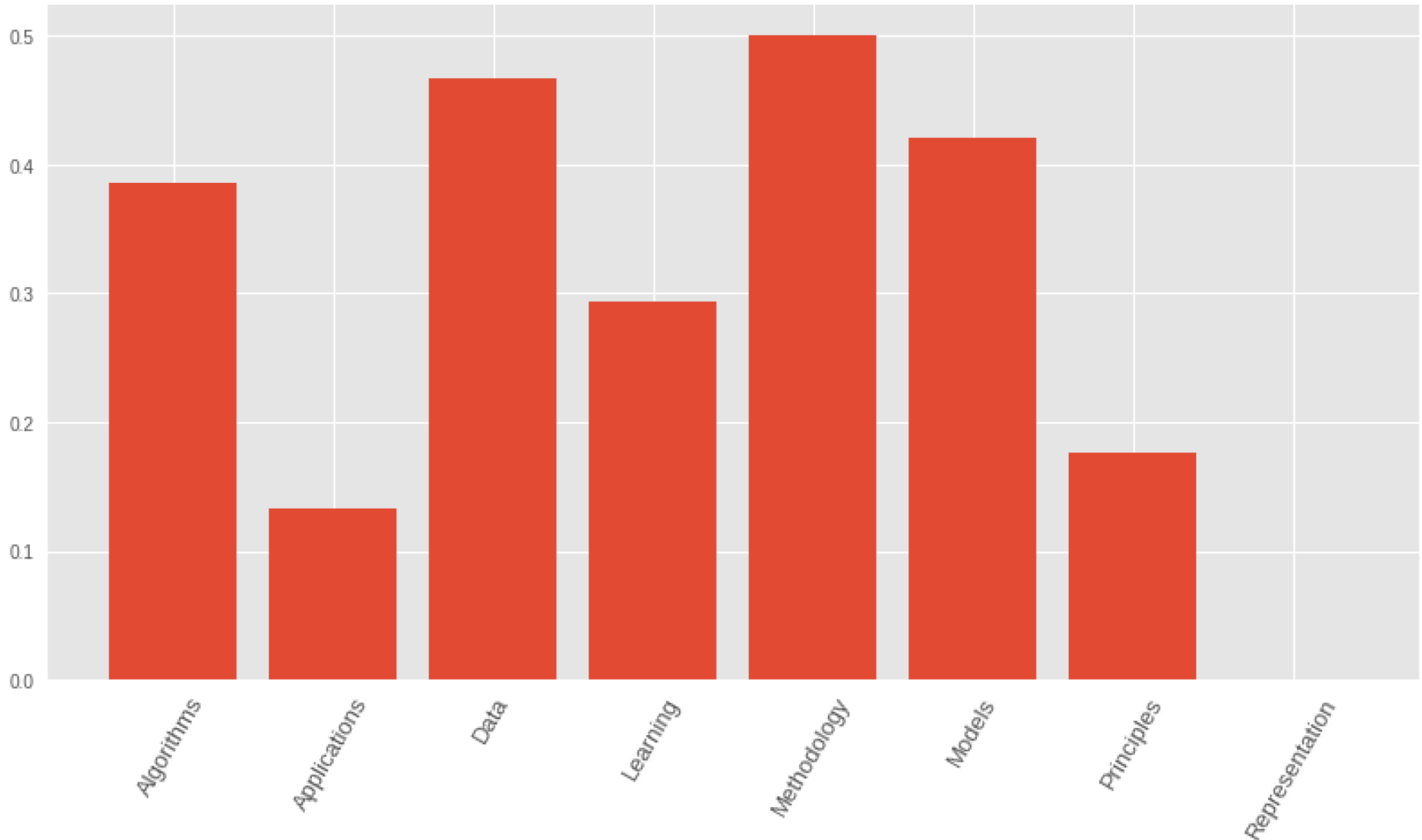


PC (all) subject areas SPC (all) subject areas

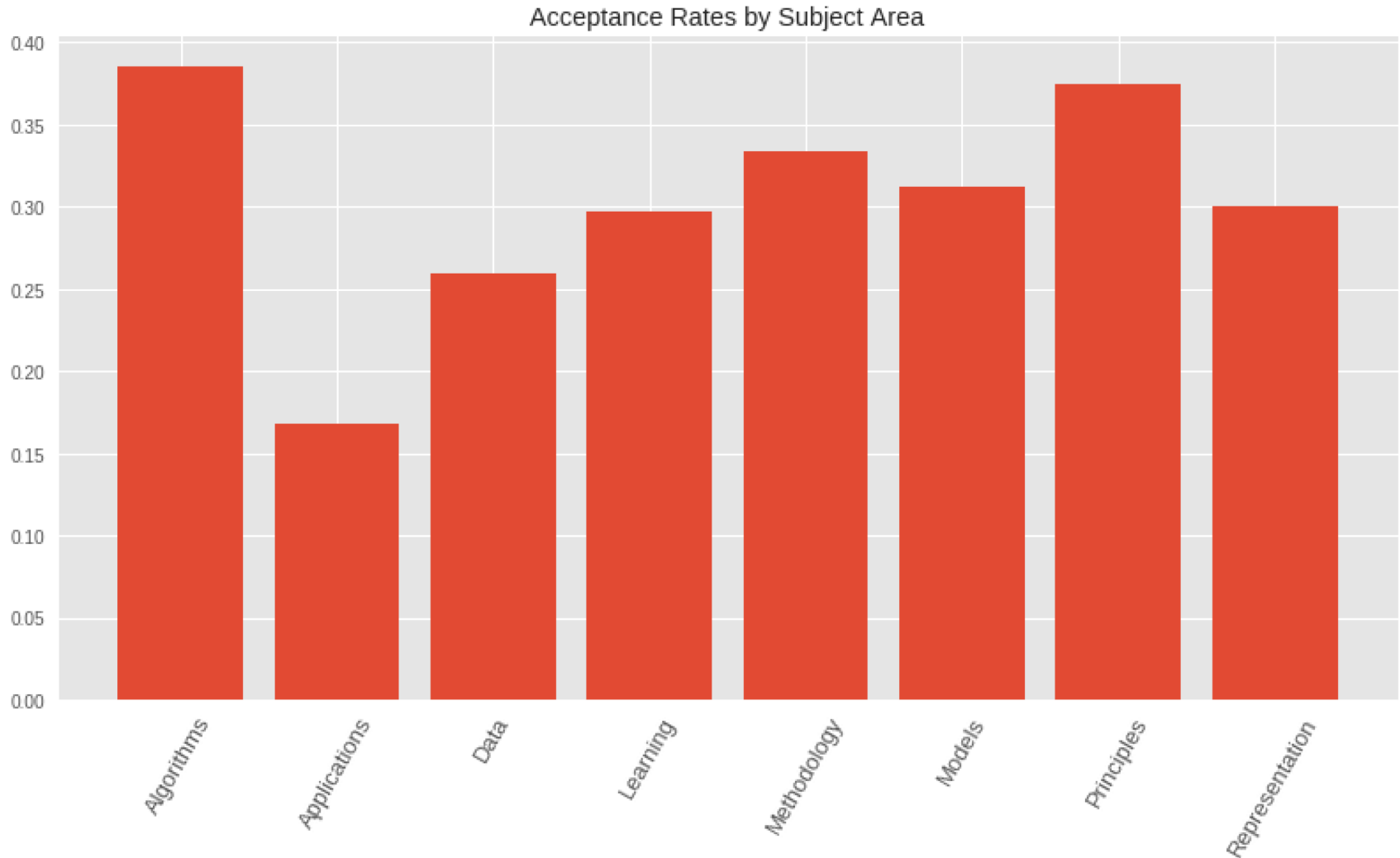


Acceptance Rates By Subject Area

Acceptance Rates By Subject Area

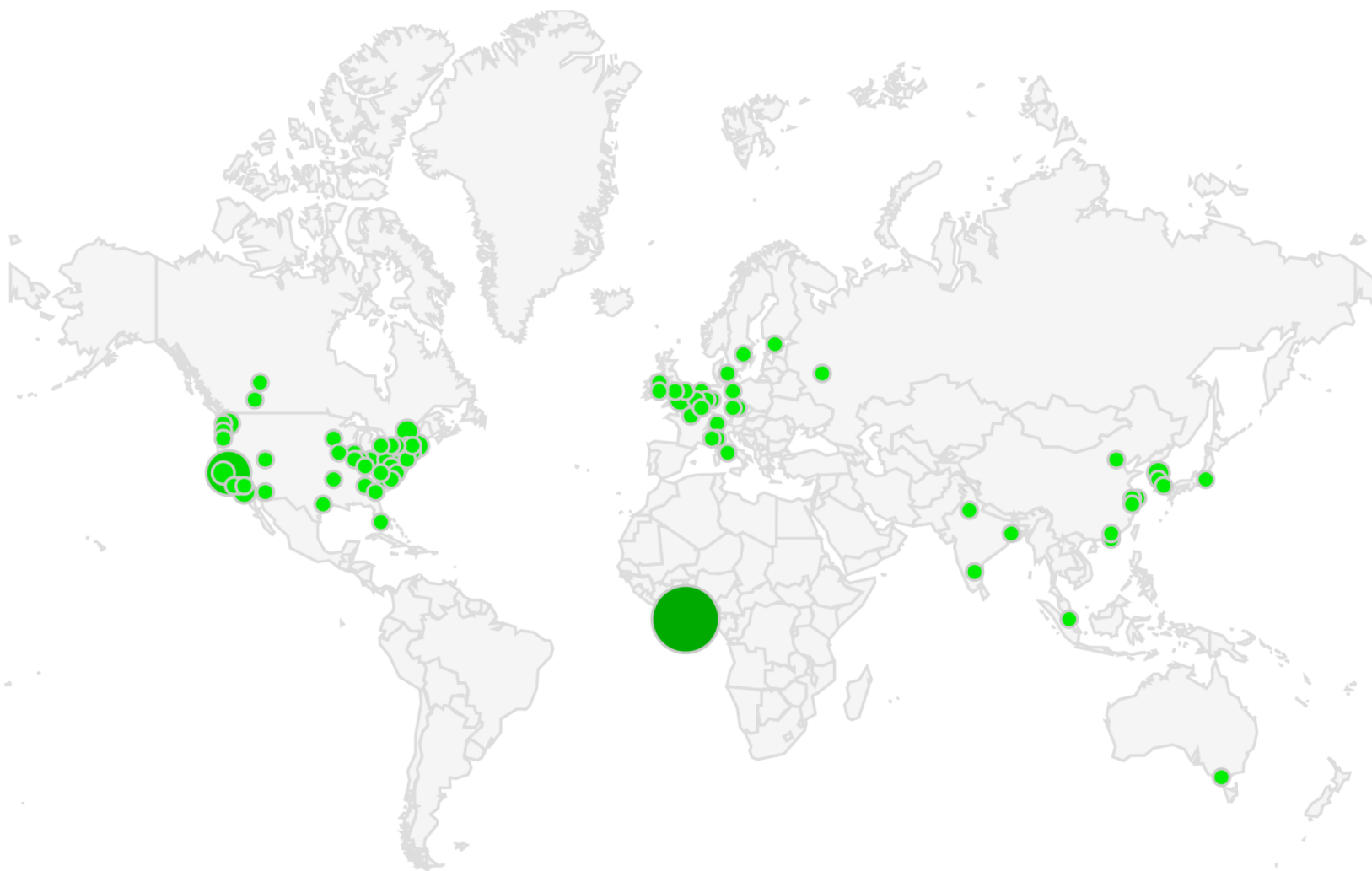

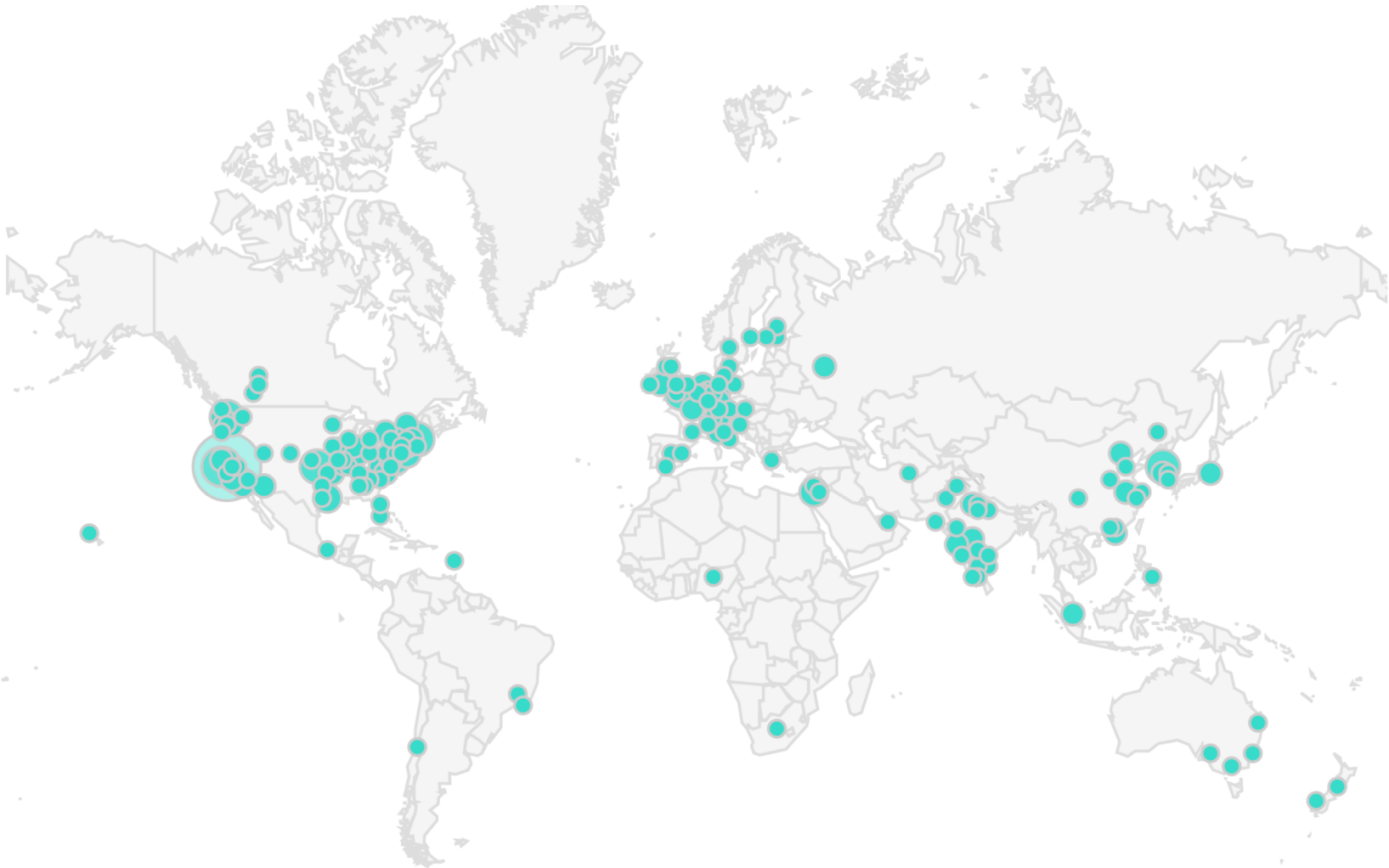

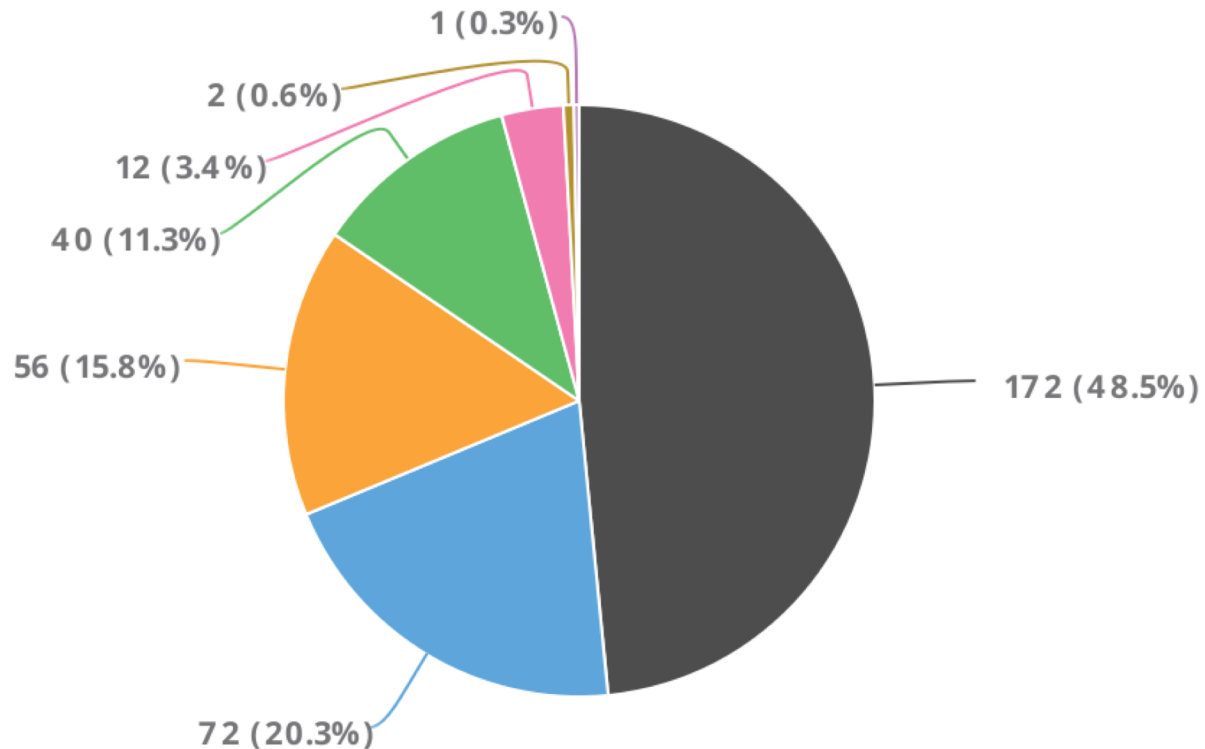
Registrants by Location



Registration Visitors by Location

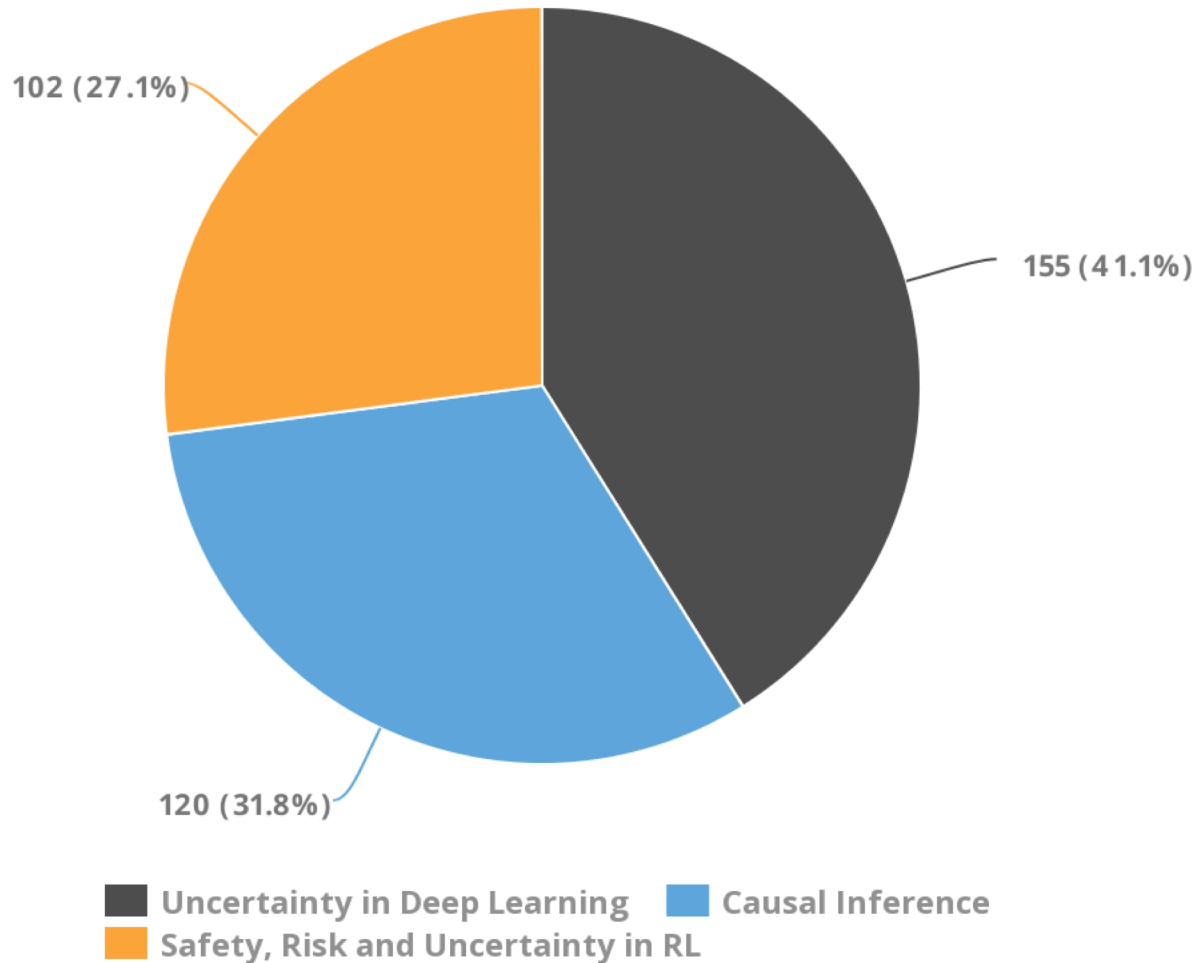

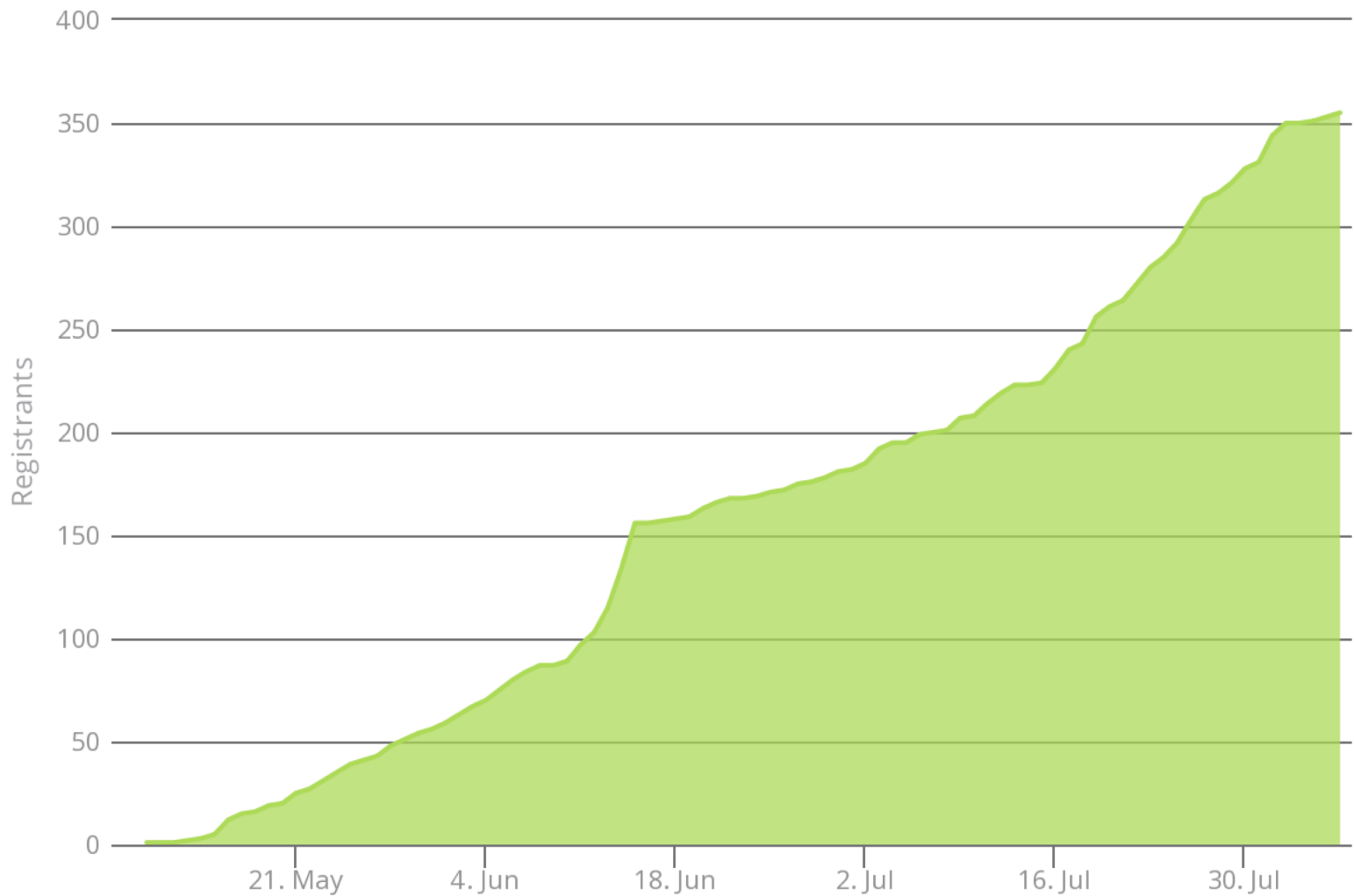

Location considerations:

- Colocation with large conferences probably not suitable, but are there other events to take into consideration (e.g. Machine Learning Summer School)?
- Move ‘away’ from locations where ICML/IJCAI are located?
- Proposals are still open ended (Europe or Israel, North America for specific places like Toronto – can we get logistics support from non-profits like universities, Vector Institute etc.?)

Open Discussion

- Submission deadline:
 - Our objective function was to maximize gap wrt ICML subject to releasing results before the NIPS deadline. Getting harder as NIPS keeps anticipating deadline. Keep it?
 - Dual submission / withdrawal might help to relax this if necessary (ICML will be earlier next year though. But will also NIPS?)
- Conference program:
 - Workshops, yes/no? Invitation only proposals?
 - Spotlights removed, any appetite for them?
- Using OpenReview:
 - Again, some glitches but also extremely responsive team
 - Discussion facilities somewhat underused, but more incentives could have been given (emails etc.)
 - Making reviews of accepted papers public? Public comments?
